The Early Childhood Education Apprenticeship (JATC MA4027) program is a an approved Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) Registered Apprenticeship that combines paid on-the-job training, related online instruction, mentorship, and progressive wage increases. The Apprenticeship takes an average of 3 years to complete and apprentices are enrolled in college classes while working for an approved training agent/employer.



TRAINING

2500 hours of PAID on-the-job training

EDUCATION

693 hours of related training instruction (completed within SWOCC or UCC's Early Childhood Education program)



TUITION

College courses will be little to no cost to apprentices through the use of scholarships and grants

REQUIREMENTS

All Applicants must:

- Be at least 18 years old.
- Have a high school diploma or GED.
- Pass a pre-employment drug screen, a background check, and other site-specific employer related polices.

Employers are under no obligation to hire any applicant they interview, and the individual must also meet all hiring criteria from each respective employer. Applicants are screened by the Apprenticeship Manager to determine whether they meet the minimum qualifications and are scored based on the selection criteria listed on the application.

TO APPLY

Applications are currently being accepted with no closing date for applying.

- 1. Download the ECE application and the supplemental form at www.sowib.org/ece.
- 2. Email the completed application and supplemental form to lpumphreyesowib.org along with proof of your minimum qualifications - a copy of your high school diploma/transcript or GED certificate and a copy of your driver's license/government issued ID.
- 3. Begin the process for the Central Background Registry to obtain proof of a current approved background check. Please ask for website information.
